What is Eco Camp?

Eco Camp is an environmental education camp run by Seminole County's Natural Lands Program.

Eco Camp has been engaging children in nature-based games, lessons, crafts and activities for over 20 vears!

Our goal is that all Eco Campers will leave camp with a sense of self-accomplishment and appreciation for science and the natural world. Camp dates coincide with Seminole public school's summer, spring and winter breaks.

Camp Activities

Each week of summer camp has a different nature-related theme, but there are a few classic Eco Camp activities every session gets to enjoy:

<u>Fishing</u>: All campers will have the opportunity to learn fishing ethics and practice with open and closed reels.

Hiking: With 180 acres and multiple habitats to explore, there are always new discoveries to be made!

<u>Games and Crafts:</u> Each week we play LOTS of outside and inside games and create unique works of art to take home.

<u>Animal Programs:</u> Campers get to handle and learn about our resident animal ambassadors in the Nature Center.



We are very proud of our skilled and passionate Eco Camp counselors! All lead instructors are public school teachers or those who have spent many years working in science education. Instructors and volunteers are background checked. All lessons are thoughtfully planned to be both educational and engaging for different ages and abilities.



Eco Camp Specs

Eco Camp is a day camp. Each session runs for one week. Campers will spend parts of the day indoors in the nature center/ classroom and outdoors exploring the property.

There are two camps for different age ranges. Our Eco Camp is for children ages 7-12. Biology Bootcamp is for teens 13-15 years old.

What to Bring

Campers will want to pack a lunch with snacks and a water bottle (refrigeration and microwave will not be provided). All campers must have close-toed shoes to participate in outside programs. It is also a great idea to pack sunscreen and insect repellant.

Week 1

Biology Bootcamp

June 2-6 Ages 13-15

Join us at Biology Bootcamp, a dynamic week-long day camp tailored for middle/high school science enthusiasts! Survivor Challenge

June 9-13 Ages 7-12

Could you survive a night in the wild? Learn the vital skills of survival - shelter, water, fire and food. Activities range from basic environmental education such as plant identification and animal tracking to survival skills such as starting a fire without matches and building a lean-to. Camping Academy

Campers of all experience levels welcome to this week of camping 101. Learn new skills and test them during fun challenges, handson practice and camping-inspired crafts. From basic survival skills, building fires, outdoor cooking, Leave No Trace and wilderness first aid, gain all the skills you need for your next camping adventure.



Eco-lympics
